Model A Coil Testing

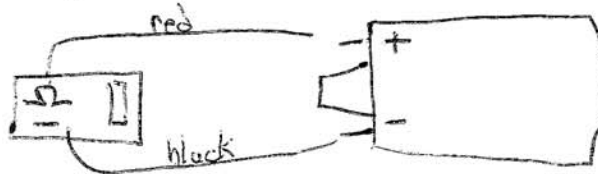

Six volt coil diagnostics using a digital multimeter. If your multimeter has an on/off switch be sure that it is in the on position.

Bench Test Procedure

A. Terminal Test

1. Set the multimeter to the ohmmeter setting.
2. Use the lowest setting (200 ohms).
3. Measure the resistance from (+) coil terminal to the (-) coil terminal.
4. Reading should be 1.5 to 1.9



B. High Tension Test

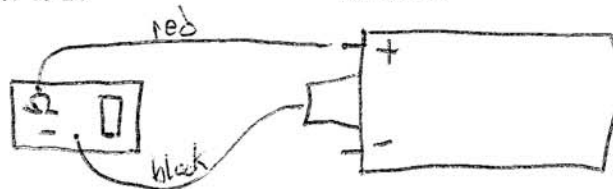
1. Set the ohmmeter setting to 10K or 20K.
2. Measure the resistance from each coil terminal (+ & -) to the high tension contact, (center of the coil).

10K reading

6.7 to 10

20K reading

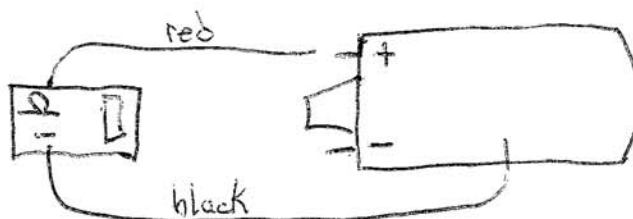
7.7 to 7.9



C. Open Circuit Test

1. Measure the resistance from both coil terminal (+ & -) to the outer coil case.
2. Reading should be zero or 1.0.

If test A, B, & C pass the coil is good! If any test fails the coil is defective and must be replaced.
